



WHAT'S CURRENTLY OPEN IN WESTLAKE VILLAGE

- Grocery stores, certified farmers' markets, farm and produce stands, supermarkets, food banks, convenience stores, and wholesale clubs that sell groceries and essentials
- Stores that sell products necessary for safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences, such as hardware stores, building supply stores, home appliance stores, and pool supply stores
- Food manufacturing, processing, storage, and distribution facilities that are not open to the public
- Restaurants or other food facilities, only for preparing and offering food provided via delivery service, pick-up for takeout dining, and drive-thru
- Laundromats and dry cleaners
- Animal feed stores, pet stores, animal daycare centers, animal boarding facilities, and pet sitters
- Plumbers, electricians, gardeners/landscapers, pest control services, property managers, and security personnel, if needed for safety, sanitation, and essential operation of properties and Essential Businesses
- Hotels, motels, shared rental units, and similar facilities
- Residential facilities and shelters for seniors, adults, and children
- Manufacturers and retailers of fabric or cloth that is made into personal protective equipment, such as face coverings, for delivery or pick-up only
- Educational institutions (if providing distance learning, providing meals, and/or performing Minimum Basic Operations)
- Animal control offices, animal shelters, and wildlife rehabilitators
- Childcare centers
- Private security companies
- Internet service and cable providers
- Radio, television, newspaper, magazine, podcast, and journalism activities
- Mobile/cell phone stores and service providers
- Banks, credit unions, and financial institutions
- Insurance companies
- Professional services, such as payroll, accounting, and legal, when necessary for compliance with legally mandated activities
- Ride-share services, taxis, and other private transportation services, for activities of daily living and other purposes authorized in the Order
- Auto, truck, RV, motorcycle, and bike repair shops
- Gas stations
- Clinics, including public health clinics
- Laboratories
- Skilled Nursing Facilities
- Home healthcare service and hospice providers
- Dental clinics
- Physical therapy and chiropractic offices
- Pharmacies
- Ancillary healthcare services
- Alcohol and drug treatment providers
- Mental or behavioral health providers
- Medical or scientific research companies, and pharmaceutical, and biotechnology companies
- Medical device, diagnostic, and equipment manufacturers, distributors, and servicers
- Veterinary clinics and all healthcare provided to animals
- Food supply
- Manufacturing and distribution companies that are critical to the Essential Infrastructure supply chain
- Construction of public works, housing, and commercial, office, and institutional buildings

Lower-Risk Non-Essential Retail Businesses Including:

The following types of Lower-Risk Non-Essential Retail Businesses can be open if they follow all requirements outlined in the Order. However, if located in an indoor mall, these businesses must remain closed unless customers can access them from outside of the mall:

- Bookstores
- Clothing and Shoe Stores
- Florists
- Music stores
- Sporting goods stores
- Toy stores

In addition, new and used auto and car sales dealerships and full service car washes can be open. Manufacturing and logistics sector businesses that supply Low-Risk retail businesses can be open.

Outdoor Facilities Including:

- Golf courses (not including pro-shops or dine-in restaurants),
- Trails
- Trailheads
- Parks (not including picnic amenities, playgrounds and exercise equipment)
- Tennis courts
- Pickle ball courts
- Community gardens
- Residential Swimming Pools including HOAs

All businesses, visitors, and those participating in activities must adhere to distancing and infection control protocols:

- Maintain 6ft physical distancing at all times
- Wear a face covering at all times
- No group gatherings allowed
- Bring your own equipment to court facilities

Prior to reopening, businesses must prepare, implement, and post the required Los Angeles County Department of Public Health Reopening Protocol, applicable to the business type or location.
